
WE NEED TO PROTECT THESE LIFE CHANGING EXPERIENCES...

ONLY 13% OF PROGRAM EXPENSES ARE COVERED BY LEADERSHIP ENDOWMENTS.

Said differently, only 13% of these experiences are protected by restricted funds.

This advanced leadership intensive equips a Ruck Scholar to lead culture change that extends beyond his chapter and campus and into his community. Executive-level alumni mentors guide attendees on how to engage in difficult and meaningful conversations — a skill they often can't develop on their campuses. Scholars are selected through a competitive application process, and they leave with an awareness of their own leadership styles and a new and better vision for the future.
